Proverbs 20:10 The Lord despises every kind of cheating.

Proverbs 20:17 Some men enjoy cheating, but the cake they buy with such ill-gotten gain will turn to gravel in their mouths.

Proverbs 20:21 A fortune can be made from cheating, but there is a curse that goes with it.

Proverbs 20:23 The Lord loathes all cheating and dishonesty.

Proverbs 20:28 If a king is kind, honest and fair, his kingdom stands secure.

SUMMARY:

Any time we give our mates less than 100% of ourselves we are cheating her, God, and ourselves. Ephesians 5:25 – Husbands love your wives even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it. Be sure to read Ephesians 5:28

DISCUSSION POINTS:

Introductory Question: Do you feel that all marriage problems involve selfishness and cheating in some form? Explain

Discussion:

- Name some ways that we all cheat our wives or an employer or our customers and thereby cheat ourselves and God.
- At your table – each person share what you believe the gift or talent that God has placed in you.
- Now as yourself and share your response: Have I allowed Him to use my talents to fulfill His purpose for my life?

APPLICATION:

- Decide to make your wife your highest priority after God; then your kids, church and your job.
- Follow the wisdom of 1 Peter 3:7 so your prayers will not be hindered.
- See your job or business as belonging to God and perform your work as though you are serving Him first.
- Seek wise counsel from Godly men as well as from God's operation manual – the Bible for all wisdom is from God. James 1:5
- If you believe that your wife needs changing – you change your heart first and have faith in God that He will bring about change in her in His time.
