

**1 Samuel 3** “Speak, for your servant is listening.”

## SUMMARY:

Samuel is a teenage boy who has served in the Tabernacle since he was 3 years old. He serves faithfully, does what he is told and yet has little understanding of who God is. He learns by experience to hear God’s still small voice. As a result of responding he becomes one of the greatest prophets in Israel’s history. Today we learn from Samuel how to hear God’s voice. See how God may change and use you as you listen to His voice.
